Please ensure you have taken your key to re-enter the premises- the passage gate and garage gate are always locked, and you will need your key for re-entry. We may not be available to let you in afterhours. The intercom can be used to contact another member inside your apartment for assistance.

In the Event of an Emergency

The Manager may be contacted on 0428 822 328; please do not text as we will not receive. If you require assistance in person and it is deemed non-urgent, a call-out fee of \$20 may be charged.

Arrivals

Arrival time is between 2pm and 4pm, or by arrangement for later hours.

Garage Gate

- Use your room key in the switch device on the driver's side, which juts out from the wall.

Parking

- One car per apartment only.
- Park in the space closest to your apartment (advised on envelope)
- Unrestricted parking is permitted either side of the street out the front of the property.

Checking Out

Check out time is no later than 10:00am.

Late check out charge \$20 per hour or part thereof, and must be arranged prior to your check out day.

Early Departures

- after exiting the garage, deposit your key in the box labelled "Key Return" - to the right of the east facing reception door.

Please note, any unreturned keys will incur a re-barrelling fee of \$175.

Accounts

Accounts are expected to be settled upon arrival. Any refundable bonds will be processed once housekeeping has completed the room.

Television & Operating Instructions

The televisions are preset to all local freeview channels. Please do not adjust the channel tunings. Foxtel is programmed into channels 101 to 110. Detailed instructions are at the end of this booklet. If you encounter any issues throughout your stay, please contact reception staff as soon as possible.

Rubbish Disposal / Recycling

Bins are provided in the garage for all rubbish disposal. For local council requirements, it is requested that you sort your recyclables from your general rubbish. In the garage, the red lid bins are for general rubbish, while the yellow lid bins are for recyclable materials, such as clean bottles, cardboard and paper.

Balconies

The property by-laws request that guests do not hang towels or other items of clothing over the balconies. Please use the clothes airers provided in your wardrobe, laundry or the fixed rail on the balcony wall.

Barbecues

Barbecues are in the cabana and on the rooftop sun deck. Please leave these facilities clean and tidy for other guests to use. Please note there is strictly no smoking (fines apply).

Swimming Pool

The swimming pool is accessible daily between 8.30am and 8.30pm.

Before using the pool after swimming at the beach, please utilise the outdoor shower to wash away salt-water and sand.

For safety reasons, no glass or breakables are permitted within the pool enclosure.

All children must be supervised by a responsible adult at all times and pool rules must be adhered to, so all guests may enjoy the facilities.

Do not use the pool if: you have had diarrhoea, crypto, E. coli or shigella infections in the past two weeks.

Parents with infants: please use disposable swimming nappies, not regular nappies as they disintegrate into the pool and cause damage. Change nappies as needed. Do not let children in the pool unclothed.

Prohibited Items

Skateboards, rollerblades, ball games and drones are strictly prohibited within the carpark, building or on the grounds.

No smoking

Beachside Holiday Apartments are smoke-free. There is strictly no smoking on complex grounds, including the garage and apartment balconies. Due to Government Health Regulations, smoking is not allowed in rooms or public areas. Managers reserve the right to evict any person found to be smoking in the premises, with no refunds. If evidence of smoking (or seen by staff) in rooms, garage, pool area, on balconies, or property grounds, there is a \$250 fee included, per offence.

Pets

Body corporate by-laws prohibit guests from keeping any pets on the premises at any time.

Garage/ Carpark

Your room key will allow access to and from the underground car park. A small box on the right hand side of the car park entrance and exit will enable you to activate the security door.



Rooftop BBQ

Our BBQ sun deck is located on the rooftop at the front of the property. Featuring a large gas hotplate and plenty of seating for the family. Access the rooftop via the first stairwell, and head straight up to the top to enjoy the view.

Please ensure that windows and doors are locked when you are not in your apartment and when retiring at night. Ensure your car is secured at all times and that no valuables are left inside your car.

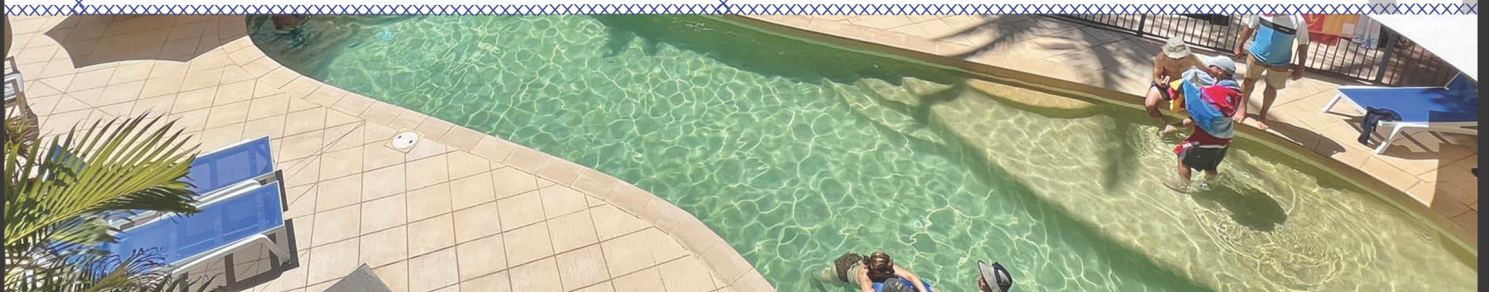
Do not let anyone unknown to you enter the building while you are entering or leaving, either walking or by car, unless they have their own Beachside Holiday Apartments keys.

Beaches of Port Macquarie...

Port Macquarie and the surrounding region boasts 18 different beaches making this destination the perfect aquatic playground.

Greater Port Macquarie is the quintessential beach holiday. With 18 beaches to choose from on the coast, visitors are spoilt for choice given that nearly all of them are perfect for swimming and water activities.

Flynns Beach

Flynns Beach is Port Macquarie's most family friendly beach, and boasts a café and shaded picnic area for those wanting to escape the sun for lunch.

Nobbys Beach

A dog friendly beach with a walking track that links through to Shelley Beach, which features a tidal lagoon.

Shelly Beach

Featuring a natural tidal lagoon, ideal for families with young children. Surrounded by spectacular rainforest that is home to local bush turkeys and goannas. Be sure to take a look at the wonderful public art on display.

North Beach

A secluded beach located at the edge of Limeburners Creek Nature Reserve on the North Shore. River Ferry from Settlement Point to North Shore, 4WD only access to beach.

Town Beach

Located a short distance from Port Macquarie's central hub, this beach is popular among visitors. Suitable for surfing when the conditions are right. A walking track traverses from the centre of town along a breakwall and onwards to Oxley Beach.

Oxley Beach

Named after Surveyor General John Oxley, who founded Port Macquarie. A walking track from Oxley Beach will take you to Windmill Hill lookout. The perfect place to picnic.

Rocky Beach

A small secluded beach, suitable for fishing and walking.

Miners Beach

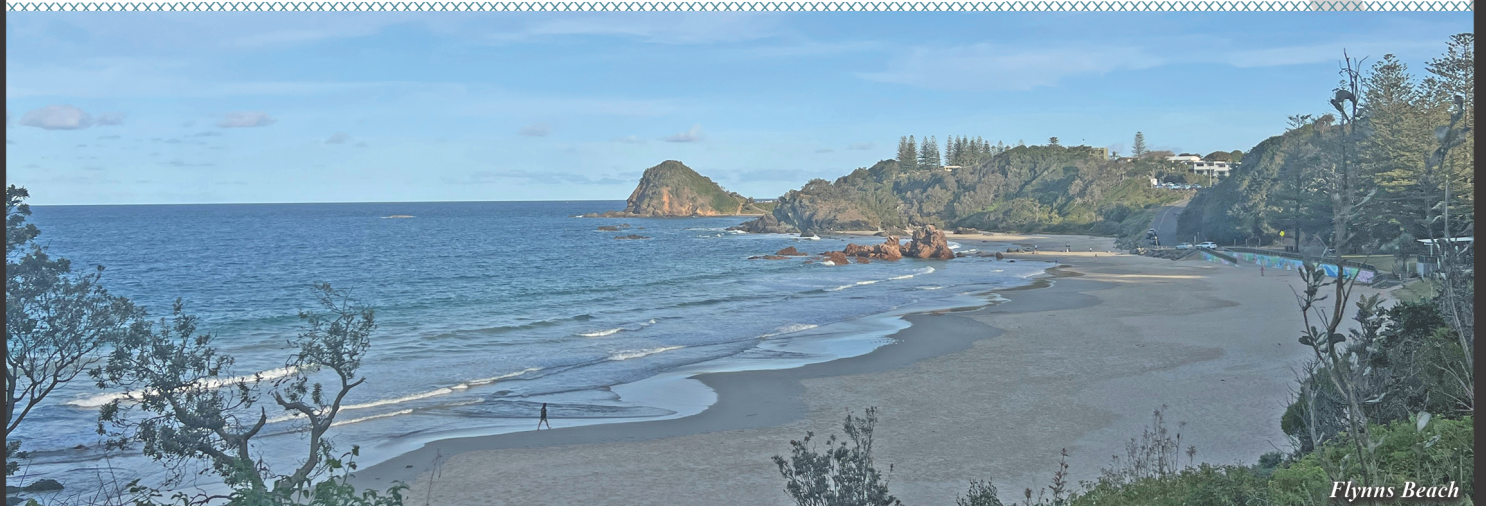
This beach has a rainforest backdrop with a walking track through to Lighthouse Road, and on to the Lighthouse.

Lighthouse Beach (Nth Watonga Rocks)

Visit the Historic Lighthouse which was built in 1879 the final stop along the scenic Coastal Walk, enjoy the many viewing platforms to get a great aspect.

The Foreshore Market

Hastings Farmers & Artists Markets

Johns River Country Market

Local crafts including paintings, folk art, leadlight ornaments, home made food, local fruit, vegetables and plants. Held the 2nd Saturday of the month, from 9am to 1.30pm, at John's River Road.

Kendell Showground Markets

Held the 1st Saturday of each month from 8am to 1pm. Local country produce, flowers, preserves and local arts and crafts. Held at Batar Creek Road, Kendall.

Laurieton Riverwalk Markets

Held on the 3rd Sunday of the month from 8am to 1pm. You will find a collection of local market stallholders selling arts, crafts, trinkets, food and produce. Held along Short Street, Laurieton.

Uniting Church Markets

Plenty of clothing, bric-a-brac, handicraft and refreshments. Held on the 1st Saturday of the month, from 8am to 11am, at Uniting Church, Port Macquarie.

Wauchope Community Markets & Arts Bazaar

Market stalls, local fruit and vegetables, bric-a-brac, plants, crafts and much more. Held on the 1st Saturday of each month, from 8am to 1pm, in Wauchope.

Wauchope Farmers Market

Held on the 4th Saturday of each month from 8am - midday at the Wauchope Showgrounds. Many local farmers bring their fresh produce to this popular market.

Sunrise Campus Markets

Held on the first Sunday at the Charles Sturt University. 8.30am - 12.30pm. Organised by the Rotary Club of Port Macquarie Sunrise, this market has quickly become a vibrant and diverse marketplace that brings together the local community, artisans, and entrepreneurs.

The Local

The Local Beachside Markets are held on the fourth Sunday of the month on Port Macquarie's iconic Town Beach, with local producers, artisans, retail stalls, kids workshops, live music and more.

Crescent Head Markets

Located near the surf club reserve in Crescent Head, this market is every second Sunday from 8am to 1pm. Also held every Sunday throughout school holidays! Community markets.

Port Macquarie Art Society Market Bazaar

This weekly Sunday market in Port Macquarie provides shoppers with an opportunity to purchase handmade local arts and crafts, a wide variety of fresh produce and delicious food. Held at Hamilton House, Hastings River Drive, from 8am to 1pm.





Nature of Port Macquarie...

Nowhere on the planet will you see a more spectacular array of natural sights than Greater Port Macquarie. Stunning rainforests, cute and cuddly koala, tropical birds and exotic orchids. Surely, this must be paradise...

For wildlife lovers, the bushland around Port Macquarie is a natural Koala habitat... Just around the corner, the Port Macquarie Koala Hospital cares for up to 300 injured and sick koalas each year with the objective of returning them to their natural habitats. It is the world's first hospital dedicated to the care and preservation of the koala. Set in the grounds of Macquarie Nature Reserve, visitors are welcome at all times. A 'Feed, Walk and Talk' tour is held every afternoon at 3.00pm. The tour showcases the current patients staying at the Koala Hospital and highlights the importance of the research and conservation work being undertaken. Once you see these adorable furry creatures, it will be hard to resist adopting one and contributing to the ongoing research and upgrades of this volunteer run facility.

Greater Port Macquarie is also the home of Australia's world renowned Koala Breeding Centre and visitors can have their photograph taken whilst patting this iconic Australian fauna. The Billabong Koala Wildlife Park is a NSW premier regional wildlife park that allows you to get up close to all the animals. The park features a wide variety of Australian and exotic animals, reptiles and birds including: koalas, monkeys, wallabies, kangaroos, wombats, cassowaries, quolls, lizards, crocodiles, meerkats, snakes, birds and much more.

For the more adventurous and adrenalin seekers, there is skydiving, four-wheel driving, horse riding and surfing to name a few. Experience the thrill of skydiving from 10,000ft above picturesque Port Macquarie and captured in a movie.

See spectacular ocean views, rare and endangered wildflowers on a bush walk or traverse through bushland past dramatic rock escarpments on a four-wheel drive adventure. Trot through native Australian bush with experienced guides on horseback or ride the waves at one of our many beautiful and safe beaches.

If you're a beginner, learn to surf from some of the best qualified coaches, some still competing on the world qualifying circuit. Hire boards or learn to surf at "Learn To Surf, Port Macquarie's Surf School" just up Pacific Drive.

Point Plomer is a popular spot for bushwalkers and surfers, alike. Catch the ferry across the Hastings River over to the North Shore and discover an untouched paradise. You can practice your 4-wheel driving techniques along the beach from North Wall to Queens Head, but be sure to obtain a beach permit first from the Visitor Information Centre. Here you can surround yourself with secluded beaches full of sea shells and rock pools and bordered by Limeburners Creek Nature Reserve.

Day Trips from Port Macquarie...

Discover Camden Haven

Just 30 minutes south of Port Macquarie you'll find the unspoilt Camden Haven. Rocky headlands and stunning coastal views that stretch forever and line the coastal strip that joins Port Macquarie to the picturesque Camden Haven.

The relaxed coastal lifestyle enjoyed by these villages and towns makes them a favourite with families. 4WD enthusiasts and fishermen of all ages. Everywhere you look there is water to be enjoyed. Choose a swimming spot to suit - vigorous surf at Rainbow and Grants Beaches; quiet family friendly Pilot Beach; the crystal clear creek at Swans Crossing and netted tidal pools at Dunbogan.

You can gain a perspective across the whole of the Camden Haven landscape from atop North Brother Mountain in Dooragan National Park. Surrounded by lakes and rivers, the mountain conserves eucalypt forests and rainforests whilst providing habitat for animals such as koalas, possums, gliders, bats and a variety of birds. Viewing platforms at the summit offer exclusive views. On a clear day Smoky Cape some 85kms north is visible, while to the south is Crowdy Bay National Park and Watson Taylor Lake.

The mountain also overlooks Queens Lake, a handy launching point for canoes. This reserve is dominated by Blackbutt Forest and includes areas of rainforest, providing habitat for a variety of native animals such as frogs, forest owls, gliders, possums and microbats. The endangered brush tailed phascogale also lives here.

Crowdy Bay National Park has long sweeping beaches, a dramatic headland, extensive wetlands, rainforest pockets and coastal heaths featuring beautiful wildflower displays. The Headland Walk is one of the best places on the Mid North Coast to view flowering heath and coastal scenery.

Lake Cathie (pronounced 'cat-eye') is just 12kms south of Port Macquarie, but feels as if you are in another world. Lake Cathie's large saltwater lake is the second largest estuarine salt marsh area in NSW. Periodically opened to the sea, the warm shallow waters are ideal for young children and the grassy banks offer picnic tables, children's playground and BBQ's around the shore. Venture up to the northern headland where a forest walk complete with a viewing platform offer fabulous views across the lake and out to the ocean.

Rainbow Beach stretches 20km from Bonny Hills to Lighthouse Beach in Port Macquarie. Practice your 4WD driving techniques along the vast expanse of sand, but be sure to obtain a beach permit first from the Visitor Information Centre. Reputably, there is always a serve of consistently good waves for body board and surfboard riders and couples will enjoy a long peaceful stroll on this idyllic uncrowded beach.

The elevated coastal views from Bonny Hills are some of the most spectacular in the region. Bonny Hills was originally home to the fishing enthusiasts but nowadays the old wood fishing shacks of the past are long gone, replaced by homes and holiday parks.

Day Trips from Port Macquarie...

Discover Wauchope

West of Port Macquarie and the Pacific Highway is Wauchope, established in 1836 to mill the timber from the surrounding hinterland.

Wauchope, pronounced 'war-hope', was a focus for the timber industry. Once the commercial hub of the region, Wauchope is the centre of the local dairy and cattle industries and the gateway to over 40,000 hectares of national parks and state forests. This bustling rural community is rich in history. Explore the tiny historic timber-getting villages that dot the countryside around Wauchope, like charming Beechwood on the Hastings River.

The picnic and recreation area at Cowarra Dam in Wauchope is an example of local public art, reflecting the local Aboriginal identity. It features magnificent ceramic mosaic seating benches, sculpted carved and decorated totems, and stainless steel sculpture. The picnic area affords the perfect place to unwind and appreciate one of nature's resources as well as recognising the site's cultural significance to the Aboriginal people.

The rugged hinterland escarpment is a further half-hour drive from Wauchope, but take your time touring around and you'll uncover some of the region's special delights.

Drive up to Bago Bluff, a local landmark, for spectacular views across the valley or try your hand abseiling down the 400metre cliff face with an experienced guide.

Bago Bluff National Park and Broken Bago State Forest are ideal areas to indulge in some bike riding, horse riding and 4WD touring, with a number of trails available through a range of vegetation from grassy open forests to rainforests.

Head towards Comboyne, where the road winds its way around mountain rainforest. The dairy-farming village of Comboyne is perched high on an open plateau and is surrounded by lush farmland and rainforest. If it wasn't for the distinctly Australian bird calls ringing out of the bush the green patchwork hills could be in Yorkshire, England.

Pack a picnic and head off on one of three rainforest walks in Wilson River Reserve part of Willi Willi National Park. A summer time favourite with locals is the Waterfall Walk, which passes close to a magnificent strangler fig, through sub-tropical rainforests to reveal a waterfall and pool.

For the intrepid, the unsealed road to Ellenborough Falls provides the spectacle of the 157metre drop, where the water spills into the verdant valley below. A walking trail takes you to the base of the falls. For the adventurous, bush tracks through the national parks can have you exploring on foot with the reward of spectacular views from some of the region's peaks.

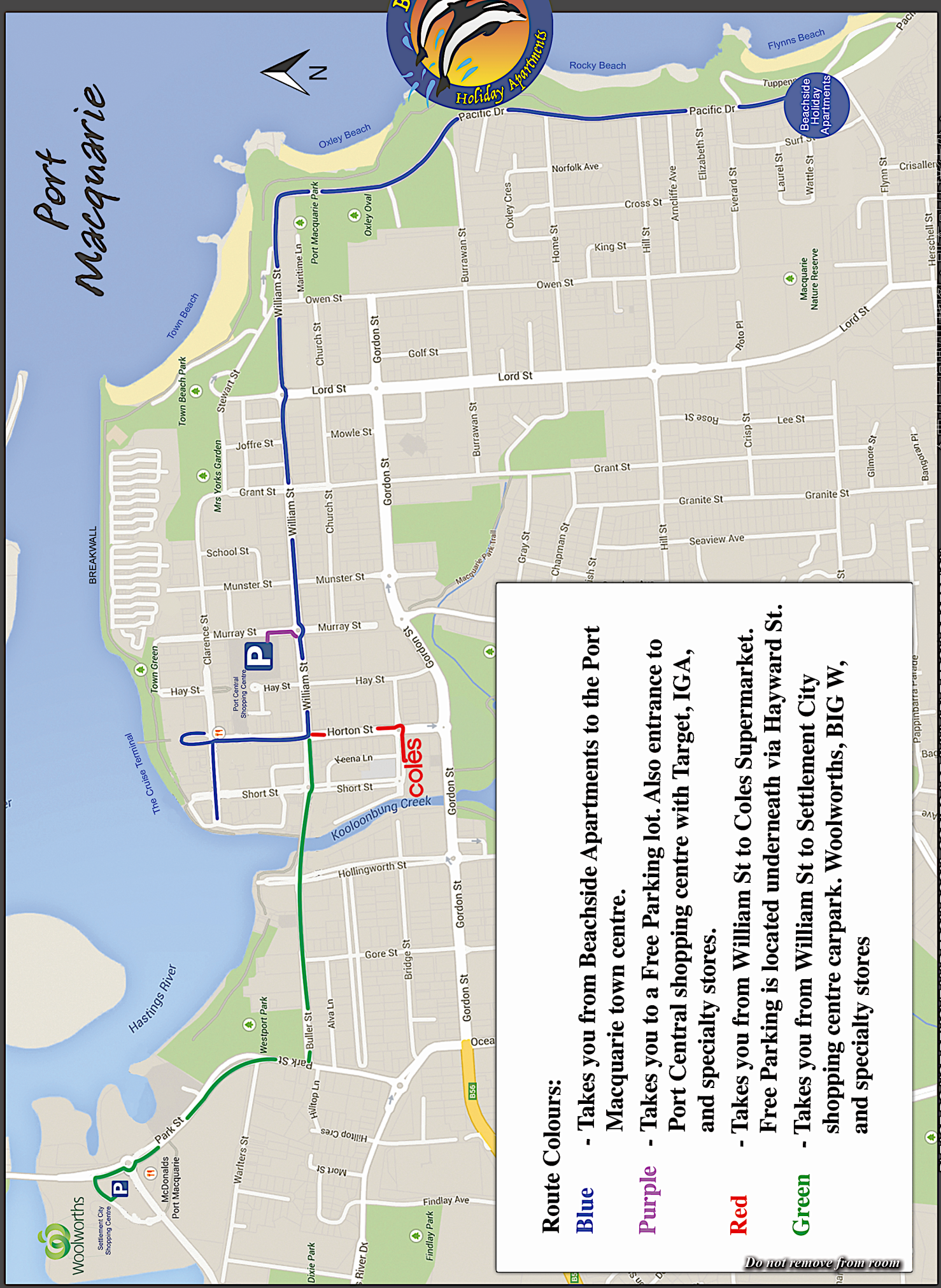
